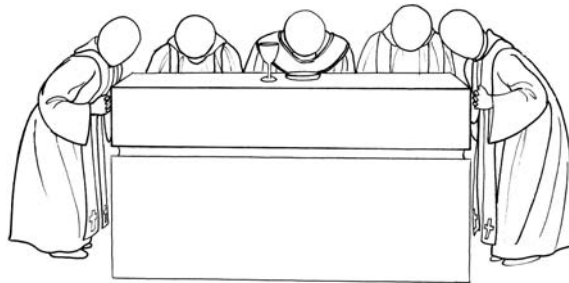


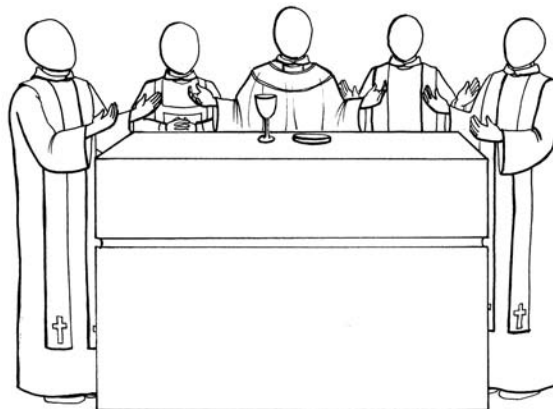
*Concelebration of the Eucharist
(Annotated for Eucharistic Prayer A)*

Keep your hands joined before your breast through the Sanctus.

Bow profoundly with the bishop through the words “full of your glory.”



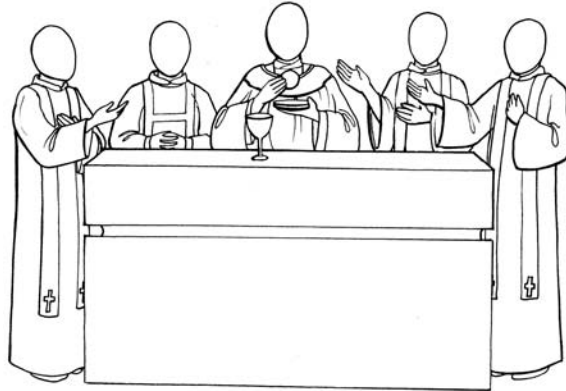
Assume the orans position.



Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love . . .

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord
Jesus Christ took bread;

Left hand on your breast, right hand extended toward the bread, palm up.



And when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, “Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.”

The bishop will pause briefly. Rejoin your hands.

After supper he took the cup of wine;

Left hand on your breast, right hand extended toward the cup, palm up.



And when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, “Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.”

Rejoin your hands and immediately resume the orans position with the bishop.

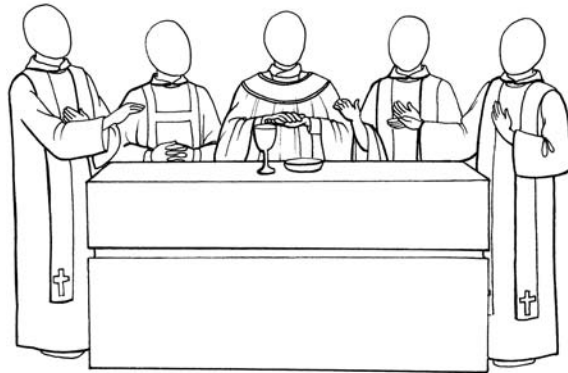
Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith . . .

Remain in the orans position, even though the bishop will be doing other things during the anamnesis and oblation.

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Left hand on your breast, right hand out, palm down.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him.



As the bishop crosses self, do so as well.

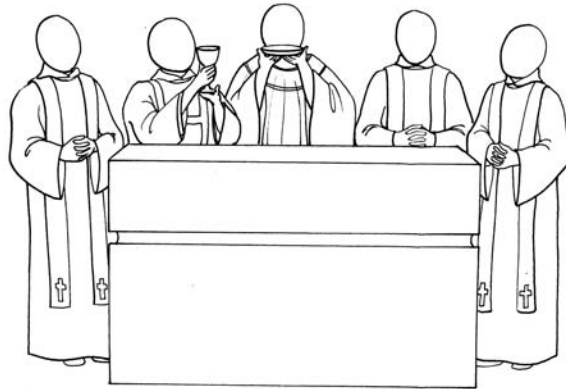
Sanctify (+) us also that we may faithfully

Rejoin your hands and immediately resume the orans position.

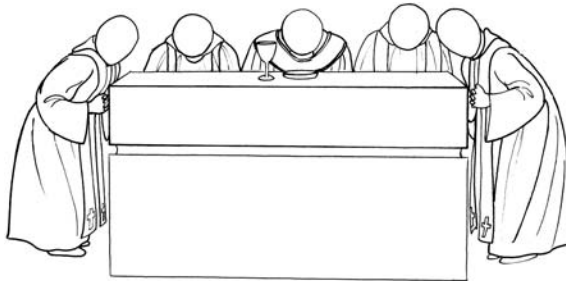
receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom. All this we ask through your Son

Jesus Christ. By him . . .

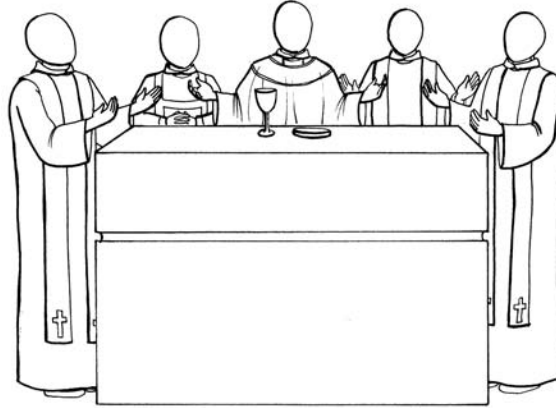
Rejoin your hands before your breast through the great Amen.
